

Summer Safety Tips

- **NEVER** leave your pet in a hot car. On a 78° day, it takes only a few minutes for the temperature in a car to reach **160°**! This will cause your pet to have heatstroke and suffocate. Animals with flat faces, such as Pugs and Persian cats, are more susceptible to heat stroke since they cannot pant as effectively.
- Keep your dog's paws cool.
- Always provide fresh water and shade.
- Apply tick/flea protection.
- Avoid sunburn.
- Keep your pet away from fireworks.



Know the Signs of Heat Stress:

- Anxiousness
- Excessive panting
- Restlessness
- Excessive drooling
- Unsteadiness
- Deep red gums or tongue
- Vomiting
- Unconsciousness
