

What it's Like to be Loved: Flapjack's Story

In early November, we encountered a heartwarming story of resilience and love. Four small dogs, overwhelmed by their owner's inability to care for them, found their way to Open Door. Among them, a surprise awaited – one had given birth

that very morning. The condition of the dogs was distressing, with Flapjack standing out, bearing a broken jaw, nose and the remnants of a difficult past. Flapjack's injuries stemmed from an incident three months prior when he was



kicked in the face by the owner's boyfriend. Shockingly, he had received no veterinary care since the incident. Swiftly, we sought professional help, but the prognosis was limited. Given the time that had passed, surgery was deemed more detrimental than beneficial. The healing process had taken its course, and as long as Flapjack could eat and drink, intervention could potentially do more harm than good.

True to Open Door's spirit, our team quickly developed a deep affection for Flapjack. Initial concerns about his quality of life were dispelled as he embraced his newfound happiness. In just a week of dedicated care, he has become a joyful little soul—eating and drinking with gusto, reveling in cuddles and growing more alert and confident each day. A compassionate staff member

welcomed him into their home, providing Flapjack with baths, soft food, medication and even adorable coats for warmth. The transformation is heartwarming – a once-neglected pup now reveling in the adoration he deserves. His wagging tail is a testament to the fact that Flapjack finally knows the joy of being cherished!




Join The Open Door Legacy Society
