



Build an Emergency Kit for Your Pet

At Open Door Animal Sanctuary, we urge all pet owners to prepare for their pets' basic survival needs. Following FEMA's guidelines, we recommend creating two emergency kits: a larger kit for staying at home and a lightweight version for potential evacuation. Regularly review and update your kits to ensure they remain ready and effective.

- Several days of food
- Water
- Medicine
- First aid kit
- Collar with ID tag and a harness or leash
- Traveling bag, crate or sturdy carrier
- Grooming items
- Litterbox, poop bags, disinfecting spay, etc.
- A picture of you and your pet together
- Familiar items such as toys and bedding
